Online and face-to-face interactions in the Romanian Attachment Parenting community

The Romanian Attachment Parenting community is a relatively new, mainly virtual community. It came to life in mainstream parenting forums, then moved to a dedicated forum, and now lives in specialized Facebook groups. Some of the early members developed a network of support and information sharing. They started blogs, private businesses and NGOs addressing the needs and consumption patterns of the community. They also organize private and public meetings.

The main goals of the research are to identify the central values and the collective goods of the community, to describe the ways through which new members are socialized in the ways of the community and to uncover how personal communities intertwine within the greater community.
